

Excerpt from Papers of the General Conference: Of the Congregational Churches in Connecticut, 1877 Samuel Nott was pastor of the church in Franklin, Conn., for a period of seventy years, ending in 1852. The story of his early life strikingly illustrates the providence of God in training men for his work. Something of that early history must be noted, if we would know the man. In 1756 the Rev. Abraham Nott, of Saybrook, on his death-bed expressed the wish that his grandson, then two years of age, might be educated for the ministry, and bequeathed to him his library. The parents of the little boy purposed to fulfill this wish, but in a few years financial misfortunes reduced the family to extreme poverty, and made it impossible to carry out this intention. All must work for a living. Between the ages of eight and twenty the life of Samuel was one of almost constant manual labor. He tried his hand at many things; and it proved a hand that could do many things well. Before he attained his majority he might have called himself a blacksmith, a farmer, a shoemaker, a tanner, or a mason; and proved his right to each title by creditable work. With a mind naturally quick and versatile, he had also an industry, and perseverance, and an ambition to excel, which made him a favorite with his employers. In homes of poverty and toil like his have been reared many of the noblest and most useful sons of New England. His parents were of Puritan stock and Puritan principles. The mother, really the mainstay of the family, was a woman of superior mind and education; sound in...
